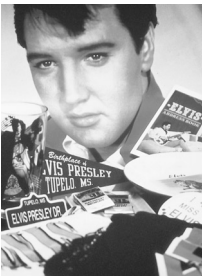


HALF DAY TOUR

and celebrity vehicles, including one purchased by Elvis Presley, are featured, along with more recent favorites such as a '57 Chevy, 300 Chrysler convertible, Jaguar XK140, Corvettes and Mustangs. Ongoing vehicle restoration projects can also be viewed through windows into the restoration areas.

All aboard the "Monster Bison Bus" to gain a close-up view of more than 250 buffaloes roaming almost 200 acres at the **Tupelo Buffalo Park**. Visitors enter the park through a restored train depot which houses a snack bar and souvenir shop. A 24-foot by 24-foot pavilion on the south side of the depot serves as a staging area for boarding the parks "Bison Buses." The buses pull into protective pens, offering an opportunity to the visitor for hand-

feeding corn and other grain to the buffaloes which can weigh more than a ton each. Feature attractions at



the park include a petting zoo, live pony carousel, trail rides, a white buffalo and several exotic animals including monkeys, a Bengal tiger, an African lion, a Reticulated giraffe, an American black bear and a reptile section.
